Lt Col Kazimierz MILEWSKI was born on March 12, 1959, in Ostrołęka. It was in that town that he went to elementary school and high school. Having graduated from high school, he started his

studies at the Stefan Czarniecki Armored Corps Officer College in Poznań. After his first officer holiday, on August 30, 1982, he was appointed the commander of a tank platoon in the 55th Mechanized Regiment in Braniewo. He was promoted to a lieutenant in 1985. Until 2006, he served as a captain in the Polish Army, including as a tank company commander and as an education officer in that brigade. At the same time he held the post

of the mobilization and supplementation officer and an education section officer. In 2006, he was appointed a major to take the post of a Specialist of the Mobilization Supplementation Division at the Armed Forces Support Inspectorate in Bydgoszcz on July 8, 2007, which he held until August 31, 2010. On September 1, 2010, he joined the ranks of additional human resources under the Human Resources Director.

On April 1, 2011, Lt Col Milewski was appointed the Head of the General Department of the

Military Center for Pharmacy and Medical Technique, a post from which he retires today.

The Center's Commander pointed out that Lt Col MILEWSKI had completed a thorough officer training, visiting all the military training grounds in Poland. In addition, he spent a month in Minsk in 1983.

'The saber, an explicit symbol of bravery and officer ethos, a melee weapon used in officer promotions, a symbol of many charges and a sign of the light cavalry, today is given to you by the circle of your co-workers and subordinates as an expression of the respect and esteem that you hold, and also of your devotion to the esprit de Corps', Col Radosław ZIEMBA, M.D., Ph.D., the Commander of the Military Center for Pharmacy and Medical Technique, said in his speech.

After the award, Lt Col Kazimierz MILEWSKI, who was saying goodbye to the military uniform, thanked for the goodbye celebration, the warm words, and the time spent together in the demanding and difficult military service in a nice, friendly atmosphere.

In the next part of the celebration, Major Mosiądz gave the command to carry the banner out. After the banner had been taken away, the head of the celebration reported to the Commander of the Center the end of the assembly on the occasion of a soldier leaving the unit.
